A Bond Like No Other: Julia's IC Experience

Longview's partnership with Ithaca College (IC) is much more than simply having access to a gym and library, it offers a connection between Longview's residents and IC's students. In recent days, I talked with Julia about her time with a pair of IC students, whom she had grown close with.

Ava Goosen and Kirsten Moskowitz are two Ithaca College Occupational Therapy grad students. This year, they had the pleasure of meeting with Julia Bentley-Macdonald (Room #235). The opportunity had arisen through their OT graduate studies, which resulted in the two of them becoming a part of Julia's life for 2 months. They assisted with many of her day-to-day activities, and got to know her by chatting and working together. They met with her every Friday afternoon.

Julia shared the history of her life with Ava and Kirsten, creating an instant bond between the three of them. As they would eat together and share anecdotes, their very different worlds collided. Julia made a point to ask about them, what they had been through, what joys they had experienced. It turns out, despite a great difference in age, there was much they shared in common with Julia. Apart from becoming fast friends, they made Julia's life a lot easier. By the time they were through, her apartment was simpler to navigate and safer, too. Some examples being: They removed tripping hazards, rearranged furniture and organized many of her documents.

The intergenerational enrichment the three felt created a new feeling altogether. Because of their bond, they became easier to spot in public. Julia was at Wegmans, and happened to run into Ava, who was able to assist her with carrying groceries. Ava later decided she would like to see Julia at her graduation, which you can see below.



Over coffee and bagels, Julia was elated to meet Ava's family. A half-hour later, Ava's mother's family had arrived. Ava introduced Julia to her grandfather, her "Pa-Pa," whom Julia got to converse with in depth. During the graduation, Julia sat next to Ava's mother, who treated her like family.

When attending the graduation, Julia was also able to see Kirsten, as seen below. Julia had the opportunity to meet her family thereafter as well.



Julia has really enjoyed the students at IC, who are "really caring," as she put it. "I have not met an IC student who I had not felt an instant bond with," she continued. The IC students are genuinely interested in getting to know people and helping people, Julia has learned, and couldn't be more grateful for the chance to meet some wonderful students and truly caring friends.
